James Weinberg

Dr James Weinberg is an Associate Professor at the University of Sheffield where he is also Director of Education in the School of Politics, International Relations, and Sociological Studies. Dr Weinberg has an international reputation when researching, writing and presenting on specialist topics in the field of political leadership and behaviour. Earlier this year, his work was recognised by the UK's national learned society for politics who awarded him the Richard Rose career prize for outstanding research contributions to advancing knowledge in political studies.
