PS retired from the Ministry of Justice in London in 2009, having worked since 2000 mainly on the law of fraud and corruption. Apart from his responsibilities for domestic legislation he was UK delegate to GRECO and other international anti-corruption bodies, and worked on EU legislative proposals in the EU Council. In this context he came to admire the work of the charity Public Concern at Work, who devised the 1998 UK law on whistleblowing and got it though Parliament without Government input. Since 2009 he has worked on a voluntary basis for PCaW and as an independent consultant. He was involved in the work towards the 2014 Council of Europe recommendation on whistleblowing and in drafting the 2014 Serbian law. He is a member of the EU Commission's expert group on corruption. And devastated by the Brexit vote.
