## Nick Gallent

is professor of Housing and Planning at University College London (UCL), where he's worked since 1999. His research is mainly focused on housing and the planning system, but often links across to community engagement with planning, and regularly looks at rural communities and places. He has published a number of books on these topics, the most recent being the Routledge Companion to Rural Planning, edited with Mark Scott and Menelaos Gkartzios in 2019, and Whose Housing Crisis, published by Policy Press in 2019. Nick is also a Fellow of the UK's Royal Town Planning Institute (RTPI) and Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors (RICS). He completed doctoral research on the planning system's contribution to the supply of affordable housing in rural areas in the 1990s. Amongst other appointments, he is an honorary professor in the Faculty of Architecture at the University of Hong Kong and a sub-panel member of the forthcoming national evaluation of research quality in UK universities (REF2021).
